## Dr. Burgess Weekly Video Address February 21, 2014 "We Must Get to the Bottom of What Happened in Benghazi"

Hello this is your congressman, Michael Burgess. It's been more than 17 months since the attack in Benghazi that killed four Americans, and still, the Obama administration still hasn't been held accountable for their actions surrounding this event, and their inaction in investigating this tragedy after the fact.

In fact, the White House is trying hard to convince the American people that this is old news or that it's unimportant. I strongly disagree.

Recently, the Senate Intelligence Committee published a redacted report of its findings on the investigation on Benghazi. This report only further points to failures within the State Department, led then by Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, who allegedly removed security measures from the United States consulate and the annex in Benghazi, despite calls for help and warnings in the days prior to the attack, and even despite the most glaring warning – this attack occurred on the anniversary of 9/11, a day that should always merit extra security for Americans worldwide.

Even more chilling is the section of the Senate Intelligence Committee report that describes how the FBI's investigation of the attacks in the aftermath of the event have been hampered. According to the report, 15 people supporting the investigation or otherwise helpful to the United States have since been killed in Benghazi.

The lack of accountability for the White House is astonishing. That's why I am continuing to do everything that I can in order to get the answers about Benghazi in order to fill the gaps in security so future attacks are prevented, and – most importantly – so that the victims' families can finally feel and have the peace that justice has been served.

I have and will continue to work closely with leaders on this issue. Congressman Frank Wolf, whose measure to establish a Select Committee on Benghazi is still gaining cosponsors. I've been on that measure for a year. Additionally, I and other concerned members of Congress recently met with Speaker Boehner, and were briefed on the investigation's progress. I have also been in regular talks with members of the House and Senate Intelligence committees, which continue to hold hearings on this issue. They are a helpful resource in keeping me up to date on the latest details of the investigation, and can be helpful for you as well.

We must get to the bottom of what happened in Benghazi, not to gain political posturing or because of personal vendettas, but rather in order to conduct our most basic responsibility as the Legislative Branch, and that's strong oversight.
