Grand Prize: Airline tickets for 2 (winning student & 1 parent) to Washington, D.C. (good for June 2013 from Dallas Love Field Airport to Baltimore Washington International Airport) to see the unveiling of their artwork at the national reception & exhibition, which will be displayed in the U.S. Capitol for the next year and a tour of the Capitol provided by Congressman Burgess' office.

First Place Award: Winning piece will be showcased for the upcoming year in Congressman Burgess' district office in Lewisville, Texas.

Best of School Award: One winning piece from each school will be selected by Art Juror from online digital submissions; these finalists' artwork must then delivered by teachers for final judging on Monday, April 15th and Tuesday, April 16th to Congressman Burgess' Lewisville office or Center for the Visual Arts, Denton. Finalists' artwork must be accompanied by the original signed student release form. **Winners will be announced** and all artwork may be picked up **at the Artistic Discovery reception on Monday, April 29th at the Center for the Visual Arts, 400 E. Hickory Street, in Denton.**

Texas Choice Award: Winner will be selected by popular vote online and displayed at the April 29th art contest reception in Denton.

Note: **Artwork does NOT have to be framed for the local contest.** The Grand Prize and First Place winner's schools will each be responsible for framing artwork by May 10th prior to shipment for display in Washington, D.C. or display in Congressman Burgess' office. Artwork must meet the stated competition guidelines.
