Grand Prize: Airline tickets for 2 (winning student & 1 parent) to Washington, D.C. (good for June 2015 from Dallas Love Field Airport to Baltimore Washington International Airport) to see the unveiling of the student's artwork at the national reception & exhibition and a tour of the Capitol provided by Congressman Burgess' office. The Grand Prize artwork will be displayed in the U.S. Capitol for the next year.

First Place Award: Winning piece will be showcased for the upcoming year in Congressman Burgess' district office in Lake Dallas, Texas.

Best of School Award: One winning piece from each school will be selected by Art Juror from online digital submissions; these finalists' artwork must then delivered by teachers for final judging on Monday, April 13th and Tuesday, April 14th to Congressman Burgess' Lake Dallas office or the Center for the Visual Arts, Denton. Finalists' artwork must be accompanied by the original signed student release form. **Winners will be announced** and all artwork must be picked up after **the Artistic Discovery reception on Monday, April 27th at the Center for the Visual Arts, 400 E. Hickory Street, in Denton.**

Texas Choice Award: Winner will be selected by popular vote online and displayed at the April 27th art contest reception in Denton.

Note: **Artwork does NOT have to be framed for the local contest.** The Grand Prize and First Place winner's schools will each be responsible for framing artwork by May 15th prior to shipment for display in Washington, D.C. or district office of Congressman Burgess. Artwork must meet the stated competition guidelines.
