In an address to the American Legion in Reno, Nevada, President Trump expressed his gratitude to the many men and women who have served our nation in the Armed Forces, and called upon the American people to hold up our veterans as examples of unity. As he said Wednesday,

"It is time to heal the wounds that have divided us, and to seek a new unity based on the common values that unite us. We are one people, with one home, and one flag."

I also would like to express my gratitude to our veterans for their steadfast commitment to the nation. These heroes have worked together, despite many differences that could have divided them, to secure our nation against threats from the enemy. We look to our veterans for motivation to work together on behalf of our country and our shared American values.
