[How are vaccines being distributed?](#)

As a part of Operation Warp Speed, the Federal Government purchased an initial 100 million doses of the Pfizer vaccine and over 200 million doses of the Moderna vaccine. The Federal Government has started distributing those vaccines on a weekly basis to the 50 states. Each state government then has the autonomy to distribute to counties in their jurisdiction. There is an [Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel](#) in Texas that decides how many doses are allocated to different providers across the state each week. [Who is eligible for a COVID-19 Vaccine in Texas?](#)

Texas has initiated Phase 1A and Phase 1B distribution. 1A includes health care workers and those who live and work in long term care facilities. 1B includes those both those who are 65+ and those over 16 years old with a chronic medical condition that increases risk for severe illness from COVID-19. [How can I get a COVID-19 vaccine?](#)

Although the state of Texas has officially initiated Phase 1B of the vaccine distribution plan, each vaccine provider is operating at different stages of the plan depending on the amount of vaccines which they have been allocated. Many of them are also still focused on Phase 1A. If you believe you are eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine, call your primary care doctor to inquire if they are enrolled as a vaccine provider. You can also visit the [Texas vaccine provider map](#) to find a vaccine provider near you in order to set up an appointment or register for a waitlist. **Please do not show up at these sites without registering first.**

[How do I register at a vaccination hub?](#)

Texas has designated [28 hub providers](#) to focus on community vaccination. These sites will vaccinate individuals in Phase 1A and 1B, but you must register unless they specifically accept walkups.

Denton County:

[Denton County Public Health Department](#) (DCPH) has launched a [Vaccine Interest Portal \(VIP\)](#) for community members to register their vaccine interest. It does **not** book an appointment immediately but will notify registered individuals of when they can register for an appointment slot.

Tarrant County:

[Tarrant County Public Health](#) has a [registration portal](#) for individuals in Phases 1A and 1B that will inform those registered when they are able to book an appointment for a vaccination.

Dallas County:

[Dallas County Health and Human Services](#) has a [registration portal](#) for individuals in Phases 1A and 1B. Dallas County and non-Dallas County residents may register. This portal will inform registrants when they can book their vaccination appointment.
